#### Pastor's Page

Having communion every Sunday during the summer means that there will be communion during our Young at Heart services in July and August. This is new for us, and has sparked some conversation and questions around what our practices are with children at the Lord's Table.

North Waseca's council discussed our beliefs and practices around Holy Communion at our meeting in June, and we have come to the conclusion that if we say "All are welcome at the Lord's Table," and truly mean *all*, that invitation includes even the youngest among us. So, we are expanding our definition of Christ's invitation to the Table!

### When can kids start receiving communion at North Waseca Lutheran Church?

Parents and families are now invited to decide for themselves when their children are ready to begin receiving communion in worship. There is no age requirement. With instruction from parents, children can begin receiving communion whenever they are ready. If you choose to announce it in our milestone moment at the end of worship, we will celebrate first communion with you then.

Will there still be first communion classes? We recognize that it is still helpful for our older students to have the opportunity to learn more in depth about communion, so we will still celebrate a Communion Milestone in 5th grade, where our 5th graders will participate in a Communion Retreat with lessons and hands on activities, culminating in a Communion Milestone Celebration in worship. This will look a lot like what First Communion has been in the past, but it will be for all 5th grade students whether it is their 1st or 1000th time receiving communion. Families, godparents, and loved ones are invited to join this celebration just as they would for First Communion. This year's 5th Grade Communion Milestone Celebration will be on **Reformation Sunday, October 29th, 2023** (date of

retreat prior to this service to be determined). It will also be open to any older students who missed this milestone during Covid.

How do I talk to my child(ren) about communion? Starting this Sunday, July 2nd, there will be a variety of resources available at church for families to take home, to help parents in their discernment and in teaching kids about communion. This includes board books and books for young readers, activity sheets, and an FAQ pamphlet I have prepared specifically for this community. This pamphlet answers questions like:

- "What is communion? What do we believe?"
- "Who can receive communion here?"
- "What if I don't understand it?"
- "What if I'm not ready yet?"
- "Will there still be first communion classes?"
- "I'm ready! How do I receive communion?"
- "What do I say after they hand me the bread/wine?"

### Young at Heart on July 9th

On Sunday, July 9th, our Young at Heart service will be centered around a theme of Holy Communion, which will include some instruction. Again, it is up to parents to decide when your children will receive communion, and they are always welcome to come up and receive a blessing until then.

We give thanks for the nourishing and sustaining gifts of grace and forgiveness that we receive in the Lord's Supper, and for Christ's invitation for all to receive these gifts.
